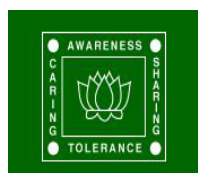

The East West Overseas Aid Foundation's Family Fellowship Program was launched in February 2005 by our Patron – The Honourable Ron Merkel QC. This unique program gives families the opportunity to make a genuine contribution whilst becoming personally involved with the Foundation on an ongoing basis.

Family Fellowship membership includes:

- Family members will be guests of The East West Foundation during their stay at the Uluru Children's Home – accommodation and meals at UCH will be provided.
- Transportation to and from the Home from can be arranged for you including pick up and drop off at Chennai airport.
- Assistance and advice for travel to surrounding places of interest.
- Membership of The East West Foundation, including regular updates and event invites.
- Family Fellowship members are encouraged to volunteer their skills in Australia and India. Please see our website for information on volunteering.

What happens to your money?

Funds collected as part of the Family Fellowship program are used for the ongoing running costs of the Uluru Children's Home and Uluru Health Care Centre.

In February 2005 a total of 21 families chose to become part of the Family Fellowship program. The funds raised were used for the construction of The Merkel Family Fellowship Building – officially opened in October 2006 – a beautiful new dormitory built to accommodate children displaced as a consequence of the December 2004 Tsunami. The building also houses Library and Music Rooms for the children at UCH.

A Family Fellow's story:

After spending some time at Uluru Children's Home as a volunteer in late 2005, Australian midwife Jenny identified the need for toilet facilities at the Alamparai Primary School where the children of UCH attend. At the time there were no toilets at the school – the children were forced to relieve themselves near the main road where they were often subject to ridicule and harassment. Upon her return to Australia Jenny's family became Family Fellowship Members and nominated that their funds be used for this purpose. In March 2006 Jenny returned to UCH for the official opening of the toilet block at the School – now the children are able to relieve themselves in a safe and hygienic environment. Jenny's children have now also become involved with the East West Foundation. Both Jenny and her children now visit Uluru on a regular basis, volunteering their time and skills both in Australia and India.
